

## **TOURIST ATTRACTIONS IN THE BALTIMORE, MARYLAND AREA**

### **Babe Ruth Birthplace Museum**

A national historic site, this museum is the birthplace of Babe Ruth. See rare artifacts, photos, videos and more--located two blocks from Camden Yards.

### **Baltimore & Ohio Railroad Museum**

This fascinating, fun place for kids, families, and lovers of history and American railroading features the most comprehensive collection in the Western Hemisphere, plus free parking and train rides.

### **Baltimore Boat Show**

Enjoy Baltimore's largest and longest-running recreational boating event, displaying more than 500 luxury yachts, high performance and sport fishing boats, and personal watercraft, plus equipment, accessories, engines and daily family entertainment.

### **East Harbor**

Baltimore's premier waterfront entertainment-lifestyle destination is located where President Street meets Aliceanna Street. Harbor East offers a collection of the area's finest restaurants and retail.

### **Harbor Place and The Gallery at Harbor Place**

The heart of Baltimore's renowned Inner Harbor, Harbor Place and The Gallery feature a mix of 120 unique shops, 13 restaurants and 30 diverse eateries, plus live seasonal entertainment on the waterfront.

### **Irish Shrine and Railroad Workers Museum**

Honoring the Irish who came to Baltimore to escape the Great Famine, two restored 1840s row homes faithfully re-create a typical Irish railroad worker's home and house a shrine dedicated to their memory and experiences.

### **Jewish Museum of Maryland**

The Jewish Museum of Maryland includes two exhibition galleries, two historic synagogues--Lloyd Street (1845) and Bnai Israel (1876)--a research library and archives, and a gift shop.

### **Johns Hopkins University Museums**

This 48-room Italianate mansion on 26 acres offers guided tours of the home and its magnificent art collections, while its carriage house and gardens are available for receptions, meetings, banquets and picnics.

### **National Aquarium in Baltimore**

Stunning exhibits and more than 11,000 aquatic animals, plus the widely lauded new exhibit, Animal Planet Australia, make this Inner Harbor destination Baltimore's most popular attraction. Express entry is available when you purchase tickets online.
